Our parish has been striving toward fulfilling our mission statement which is:

As a result, we see abundant fruits throughout our parish with respect to each part of the mission statement.

There have been great strides in evangelization efforts with The Rescue Response team along with other volunteers providing hospitality for another round of The Rescue Project. We have hosted Archdiocesan trainings on how to accompany others as a sponsor and will soon host a second workshop on how to evangelize. Efforts have begun in developing small groups and new leaders through Catholic Christian Outreach with the intention that new groups will form and share the Word of God with others. New work has begun in cooperation with Communio to draw more souls to Christ through evangelization and discipleship of marriages and relationships. The Fridays of Lent saw hundreds of parishioners and those in the broader community enjoy the fish fry, mobile confessions, and the Stations of the Cross. We continue as a parish to use the Hallow Prayer app as a tool to pray as a community

The youth ministry continues to flourish with middle schoolers and high schoolers spending evenings sharing their faith in fellowship. Family formation is bearing fruit with families attending monthly classes together to learn the faith and then going out to continue their work as primary catechists of their children supported by the parish. The monthly adoration hour is well attended, and the catechesis will continue with a focus on Mary, our Mother, and her role in our lives. Numerous ministries, both established and new, are flourishing as we respond to the promptings of the Holy Spirit.

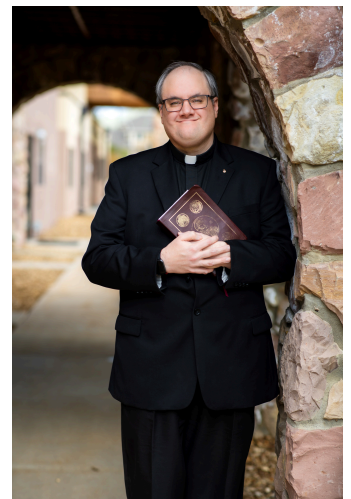

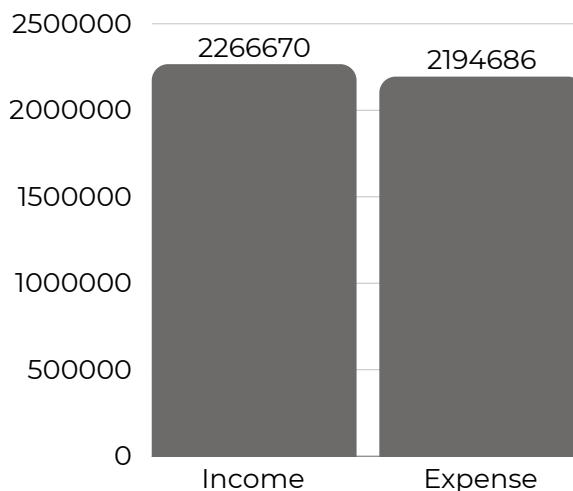

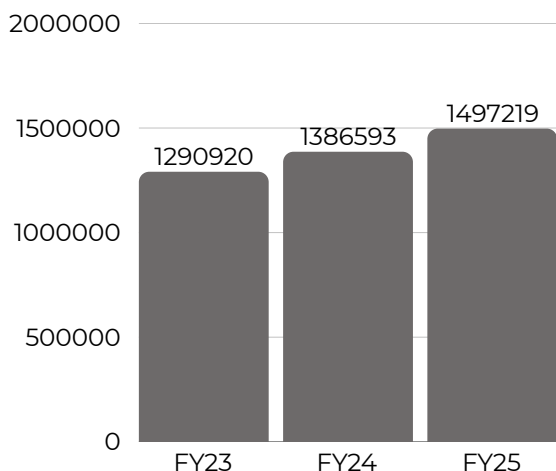
